Masking Up in Love

The statistics don't lie: COVID-19 infections are on the rise in Oregon again, many of them the extremely contagious Delta variant. Following the recommendations of the Oregon Health Authority and the Centers for Disease Control, **St. Andrew now requires EVERYONE – even**



vaccinated individuals—to wear a mask inside the building. Disposable masks are available at the Narthex entry if you need them.

As Pastor Susan reminds us, "we are building this ship as we sail." We have made a few changes to worship, beginning this Sunday, that will help our community stay safe.
