What better way to prepare for Lent (orig. Old English *Lencten,* meaning springtime) than to get our hands in the soil to prepare for spring planting?

Please note: Children are welcome, with supervision by an adult. Bring your own food, water/beverages. Bring your own cooler if needed. Dress WARM and wear shoes/boots that can get wet and muddy. Bring tools you anticipate using: shovels, hoes, trowels, work gloves. Masks are required for individuals over 5 who have not been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, unless you are working six or more feet away from fellow volunteers. Family members and other closed groups who are vaccinated are welcome to work in close proximity to one another without masks.

Adult Education Classes

A new Adult Education term begins next <u>Sunday, March 6</u>, when Paul Navarre and Pastor Mark launch their courses for Lent.



Paul Navarre will look at Christian shifts in beliefs that have caused division within Christianity in a class called "From Abraham to the ELCA." Join him in Fellowship Hall at 10:00 am the first Sunday in March as he looks at the many divisions believers in God have adopted—Christians and Jews, Protestants and Catholics, Lutherans and Calvinists, and even the different types of Lutherans.

At the same time, Pastor Mark will teach his class, "Preparing to Die," in the St. Andrew Room. Pastor Mark promises to offer "practical advice and spiritual insight grounded in our faith tradition." As uncomfortable as most of us are in considering our own



deaths, we will all make that journey into the unknown. Preparing for it by planning a memorial service, deciding where and how to be buried, and anticipating resurrected life may make the process easier.

Recycling Tidbits



I contacted the recycling department for Beaverton about whether yogurt containers can go into the mixed recycle curbside bin. The rules say that containers less than 6 ounces can't go in the bin. This is the response I got:

"The 5.3 ounce yogurt containers hold six fluid ounces, so they are a "yes" and can go into the mixed recycling. They are large enough not to get lost in between the pieces of paper at the sorting facility and end up at the paper mill."

I also learned this about caps and lids:



"Plastic caps and lids of any size cannot go into the mixed recycling. At the sorting facility they behave like paper and end up baled with the paper and sent to the paper mill where they are contaminants and thus garbage.

"That said, large thick metal lids like those from a jar of spaghetti sauce can go into mixed recycling, just bend them slightly so they're easier for the magnet to pick up. Metal caps and smaller pieces of scrap metal must be contained within a metal can and crimped shut, as the smaller metal pieces get lost in the pa-
