Reduce Gun Violence: Lift Every Voice Oregon (LEVO) Update

As of June 15, there are 1,025 circulators who have gathered 65,000 signatures in support of LEVO Common Sense Initiative Petitions (IP 17). Based on recent research, the most important law to save lives is one requiring a permit to purchase a gun. When Connecticut passed its law, the state saw a 40% decrease in gun deaths. This initiative is focused on permit to purchase and less lethal ammunition.



We need 140,000 signatures by July 8 in order to bring it to the ballot in the upcoming November 2022 election. I will be in the Narthex again on **June 19** between services to gather signatures. Horizon Team: What Is the Spirit Saying to the People of St. Andrew?

In preparation for discerning what the Spirit is telling the Horizon Team, we considered Revelation 1-3 in which John the Apostle recorded messages proclaimed by Jesus and the Holy Spirit to seven of the churches in Asia Minor. Likewise, the Horizon Team has considered what the Spirit is telling the Angel of St. Andrew, the Church with the Solar Panels, following our Horizon Listening event. See what the Spirit is saying to the Horizon Team....

I see you are worried about many things. You are deeply committed to keeping things going. And you are tired, wondering how things can keep going as they are, or better.

I see your faith active in love. I know your love for the church and for the earth. But I wonder how you are receiving my love, my Spirit Power, my Spirit Energy and Direction. You seem to have gone ahead on your own without me.

Stop. Give yourself a break. Let a void speak before it is filled. Let some silence sit before speaking. Let some grief surface without having to push it into a corner. Void, and Silence, and Grief are some of my best teachers. I worry that more people don't learn from them.

So, you're not what you used to be. You're not what you were once upon a time. But you are still a mostly healthy church, with lots of experience, lots of talent, lots of resources. Look within and among. Look to me. Look to the Spirit in hidden places. I'm looking out for you.



Acknowledging Great Progress

It's appropriate for the congregation at St. Andrew to pause a little and recognize how far we've come in drawing down the mortgage. Ken Reiner shares the email he sent recently to Pastor Mark and Jeff Smith, chair of the Stewardship Committee.

I was deleting old email and came across St. Andrew's Financial Team report from March 31, 2015. At that time, the mortgage balance was \$2,198,150 and the monthly payment was \$15,271. In addition, the M&M Fund owed the Mortgage Fund \$25,590.50 because of internal borrowing to meet monthly expenses.

Fast forward to Spring 2022. As of May 31, 2022, our Mortgage Fund balance is \$550,241.99 and the Monthly Mortgage payment is \$12,732 with about \$10,900 of that going to the principal of the loan with no internal borrowing.

All of you have been very generous with your contributions to St. Andrew to support the ministry and to retire the mortgage debt as soon as possible. THANK YOU!


Comments from the Congregation During the Horizon Listening Event

Time says "Let there be" every moment and instantly there is space and the radiance of each bright galaxy.

And eyes beholding radiance. And the gnats' flickering dance. And the seas' expanse. And death, and chance.

Time makes room for going and coming home and in time's womb begins all ending.

Time is being and being time, it is all one thing, the shining, the seeing, the dark abounding.

Best known for her works of speculative fiction, Ursula LeGuin preferred to be known simply as an "American novelist." Though she was raised, as she put it, "as irreligious as a jackrabbit," in her teens and adult life she took a keen interest in Taoism, Buddhism, and ideas of balance, equilibrium, and ephemerality.
