tion marking a milestone in the lives of our youth. Don't miss this joyful Sunday celebration!


Earth Camp Lost & Found

The Spirituality Book Group will meet at 3:00 pm on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>July 23</u>, to discuss *How the Word Is Passed: A Reckoning with the History of Slavery Across America*, by Clint Smith. In this debut work of nonfiction, the author leads readers on a tour of landmarks and monuments to reveal some of America's stories hidden in plain sight. Consider

Monticello, the Virginia plantation owned by Thomas Jefferson. It was here that Jefferson wrote letters espousing the urgent need for liberty—at the same time he enslaved more than 400 people. This well known history is augmented by other stories much less familiar, but all combining to illustrate slavery's role in shaping American history.

Labyrinth Walk on Saturday, July 22

On <u>Saturday morning</u>, <u>July 22</u>, labyrinth walkers, or those new to experiencing or learning about the labyrinth, are invited to gather by a beautifully landscaped labyrinth located off Skyline Blvd. One of more than 100 labyrinths in Oregon, this outstanding outdoor labyrinth is set beside a forest and offers an impressive view of the Tualatin Valley.



As noted by The Rev. Dr. Lauren Artress, an internationally recognized labyrinth scholar, this beautiful setting offers a path for prayer, a walking meditation, a crucible for change, and a watering hole for the Spirit.

Directions to the private property where the labyrinth is located will be provided so that we're able to begin our walk about 10:00 am on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>July 22</u>. Potential walkers are invited to learn more about labyrinth experiences and to bring their journals and cameras along in order to recall them later. We'll be able to sit in contemplation to record our experience and take photos, too.

Plastic-Free July: Small Steps, Big Difference!

Every July, millions of people around the world take their own plastic-free steps by choosing to refuse single-use plastic. Last year, participants avoided 2.6 million tons of waste! It doesn't matter what choice you make—switching to reusable cups, avoiding plastic packaging, or inviting family and friends to take part—together our small steps make a big difference. If it seems overwhelming, start with just one step. What's your step? Consider these ideas:

Start by discontinuing the use of plastic water bottles. Carry a reusable bottle in your car. Get in the habit of keeping your water bottle with you at work, the gym, school, events, and when you travel. At the airport, you can take your empty bottle through security, then fill it at one of the many filling stations (usually located near the restrooms) before you board the plane. Despite many people making the switch, plastic beverage bottles and plastic bottle caps were in the top five items collected globally through beach cleanups and other initiatives as recorded in Ocean Conservancy's 2022 annual report.

Or start by swearing off single-use "paper" cups, which are partially made of plastic. They would leak if they were truly made of paper. Billions of disposable coffee cups end up as

landfill and litter every year. Beware of disposable cups advertised as "compostable." They are only compostable if they can be processed at a special composting facility, which is unlikely to happen because such facilities are few and far between.

You can always just grab a cup from home and keep it with you. But the most popular travel cups are made of glass, ceramic, or insulated stainless steel with sealable silicone lids. I have 2 ceramic cups that live in my car.

Sadly, a lot of drive-through coffee shops do not allow personal cups, but most store-front coffee shops will serve your coffee or tea in your personal cup, especially now that we are through the worst of the COVID scare. Better yet, take a break from the rat-race pace of life and take time to sit down at a café to enjoy your hot beverage from a real cup!
