Ministry Site Profile: What's Exciting?

The Ministry Site Profile (MSP) provides key information for the synod and prospective pastors about St. Andrew and our community. In the Our Vision for Mission section of the MSP we are asked to describe what the congregation is excited about right now. The Transition Team invited input from the congregation to answer that question. Your responses were used to develop our response for the MSP.

The congregation is excited about a new lead pastor, our various ministries, and providing space for a Head Start pre-school program. A new lead pastor brings new ideas and possibilities that are exciting to St. Andrew members. Our interim lead pastor has helped the congregation transition to new worship and music approaches and has helped us gain new appreciation of our ministry work. During September 2023 the MACG team coordinated a Ministry Fair. It was the first opportunity in a long time for members to learn about all the ministry activities that are thriving at St. Andrew. The congregation is especially excited about Earth Care, the children's ministry program, adult education, Lutheran World Relief, many service projects, and support of an Afghan refugee family. St. Andrew's children's education space was specifically designed for a pre-school. Although we were unable to sustain this type of ministry on our own, the congregation is still committed to supporting early childhood education and development. The Head Start program at St. Andrew provides an opportunity to support the community and share our commitment to supporting children and families. Each new season brings a spirit of renewal as we strive for energy, hope, and connection.

Weather Alert

Climate Corner: How to Treat Pet Waste

For many of us, our pets are part of the family. We love our dogs, cats, canaries, gerbils, and more. Living with other species can provide companionship, fun, and comfort, but living with pets does have some challenges. Portland's Metro Master Recycler Handbook provides the following information and guidance. Did you realize that...?

The eggs of certain roundworms and other parasites found in pet waste can linger in your soil, putting you, your children, and your pets at risk of exposure while gardening, playing sports, or walking barefoot. Pet waste on the ground also contributes to runoff that pollutes waterways. Always pick up pet waste and dispose of it in a bag in the garbage. Never put feces or litter in your home compost bin. Avoid utilizing the sewer system [flushing pet waste down the toilet], as that system was designed to break down bacteria specific to human beings.

Dog Waste: Picking up dog poop promptly protects people, pets, and waterways from harmful bacteria. Place the waste in a used plastic bag and discard in the garbage.



Cat Waste: The best environmental choice is to keep your cat indoors. This will keep waste manageable. Cats also kill local wildlife. The American Humane Society states this is also the best choice for your cat's health, life satisfaction, and safety. Cats make a tasty meal for coyotes.

Place cat waste and litter in a used plastic bag and discard in the trash. Bagging waste protects garbage collectors and sanitation workers from harmful bacteria. Always wash your hands after cleaning the litter box. Cat feces can carry toxoplasmosis, a disease that is dangerous for infants, pregnant women, and people with weakened immune systems.

Following these guidelines is good for our watersheds and ourselves.

Amina Malik Zada has her driving license! She passed the driving test on her first attempt on Tuesday, January 2, and got the temporary license that Thursday. Amina has cited numerous Afghani friends who took the test multiple times before passing,

so the Pacific Driver Education lessons, funded through the Sanctuary Team, made a huge difference.

On Friday morning, January 5, Bob Stadel picked up Nasir to take him to the WorkSource Center (where staff are exploring other job options for Nasir) and as they departed, Nasir gave Amina the keys to their car. Amina said she put the two little ones in car seats and drove over to visit her friend Freiba – driving by herself for the first time! She was clearly delighted and expressed thanks to the team and the church for all the help and assistance in realizing that goal.



An Oregon driver's license has opened up a wide variety of new possibilities for Amina Malik Zada and her family!

Nasir takes the family car to work early in the morning and then uses it to do food delivery and ESL classes in the evening, so for now we will still need to provide transportation and childcare for Amina to attend ESL classes and appointments during the day. However, Tom Jelineo is working to secure funds for a van that will accommodate the entire family. In December, Harvey and Carol Blomberg generously donated their car to the church for that purpose. The car was sold, enabling the Sanctuary Team to set aside seed money for another vehicle.

We are proceeding slowly as a second car will add considerable expense (e.g., insurance, fuel) and the Malik Zada budget is limited. However, as the youngest child, Mohammed Ali, nears an age when he can attend Head Start, Amina is expressing desire to enter the workforce, possibly re-engaging with her earlier career in education.

Kyler Vogt began his new role as St. Andrew's Director of Next Generational Ministry this past October with the goal of bringing younger people into our community and ensuring it can be sustained long into the future.

In addition to continuing to oversee all aspects of children and youth ministry, from the Nursery to The Roots, Confirmation, the High School Youth Group, and Earth Camp, he is focusing on increasing congregational involvement in support of all children and youth ministries.

As new leadership and involvement is developed, Vogt is:

- Producing Andy's Room Podcasts to amplify the voices of younger people in and around our congregation [See the article on page 3 for details];
- Increasing the visibility of younger leadership by preaching monthly and teaching additional Adult Education classes;
- Attending Worship Planning meetings to collaborate in creating an increasingly intergenerational worship experience; and

• Developing new programs specifically for younger adults and families, which will be coming soon.
