YOU ARE WELCOME HERE!

At St. Andrew Lutheran Church, we strive to be a loving and welcoming community of faith. We are centered in the Good News of Jesus Christ, who calls us to reconciliation and wholeness in a world of alienation and brokenness.

All are welcome, without exception, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, physical or mental ability, education, income, or family status.

All are welcome here to worship God, receive the sacraments, and share in fellowship, leadership, and service. We commit to treasuring one another's similarities and differences as one body in Christ.

We are called to provide a safe space in the community as we break down the isolation barriers. We will continue to discover what it means to be "Reconciling in Christ."

<u>Masks</u> are not required in our building, however, if you wish to wear one, you are more than welcome to do so. Complimentary ones are available in the narthex if you do not have a mask.

Restrooms are on either side of the elevator, which is left of the coffee bar. A gender-neutral, ADA-compliant restroom is adjacent to the kitchen entrance opposite the elevator.

<u>Green-topped Welcome Cards</u> are found in the pew rack before you if you wish to fill one out. Place it on the offering plate or hand it to an usher after the service.

<u>Children are welcome in worship!</u> God put the wiggle in children, so don't feel you have to shush or suppress those wiggles in God's house. All are welcome here! Consider sitting toward the front where it is easier for them to see and hear what is happening. If you have to leave the service with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. There are worship activity bags available for children in the back of the sanctuary.

Everything for Worship is contained within this service folder. Congregational responses are printed in **bold**. Instructions for the assembly are in Italic print. *Information for the assembly is found in the boxed text*.

<u>Holy Communion</u> is included in this service. All who desire to receive communion may do so. We believe our Lord Jesus is truly present in, with, and under the bread and wine. All of the bread used in communion is both gluten-free and lactose-free. Alcohol-free grape juice is also offered in the second (celadon) chalice.

GATHERING

THE HOLY SPIRIT CALLS US TOGETHER AS THE PEOPLE OF GOD.

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters the birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not the way we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross around which we gather, the tree into which we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not appear all that impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with a power beyond our understanding.

²⁶Jesus said further, "The reign of God is like this: a sower scatters seed on the ground, ²⁷then goes to bed at night and gets up day after day. Through it all the seed sprouts and grows without the sower knowing how it happens. ²⁸The soil produces a crop by itself – first the blade, then the ear, and finally the ripe wheat in the ear. ²⁹When the crop is ready, the sower wields the sickle, for the time is ripe for harvest."

³⁰Jesus went on to say, "What comparison can we use for the reign of God? What image will help to present it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed which people plant in the soil: it is the smallest of all the earth's seeds, ³²yet once it is sown, it springs up to become the largest of shrubs, with branches big enough for the birds of the sky to build nests in its shade."

ACT OF FAITH

- P: As a community of faith, we profess our part in the tradition and history of the church, using the Apostles' Creed. The Apostles' Creed is centuries old. Though some of the language seems archaic today, it unifies us throughout generations, and invites an ongoing faith that seeks understanding.
- A: Let us affirm our faith using the words of the Apostles' Creed:
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

A: Jesus, Bread of life, you have set this table with your very self, and called us to the feast of plenty. Gather what has been sown among us, and strengthen us in this meal. Make us to be what we receive here, your body for the life of the world.

- P: The Lord be with you.

- C: It is right to give God thanks and praise.
- P: It is our duty and delight that we should everywhere and always offer thanks, and praise to you, O God through Jesus Christ who is your light which no night can overcome, and so with the church on earth, all creation, and the host of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

- P: Holy are you, God of power and might.
- C: Heaven and earth are filled with your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in your name. Hosanna in the highest!

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: You are indeed holy, almighty, and merciful God. We give you thanks for his coming into the world to fulfill for us your holy will and to accomplish all things for our salvation.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

P: This we pray through Jesus Christ, our Savior, and our friend.

C: Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, O God, now and forever.

LORD'S PRAYER

- P: Make us bold, O merciful God, to address you as our Abba as we pray:
- C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

The congregation is seated.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

We receive the elements by intinction. A piece of bread (gluten and lactose free) is placed in your hand, and you may dip it in a common cup of wine (red chalice) or grape juice (celadon chalice). If you are uncomfortable dipping in the common cup, the Church has long believed that communion 'in one kind' – just the bread – counts fully as partaking in the Lord's Supper. If you do not wish to receive the elements, you may cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing from the pastor, or simply stay in your seat.

P: Christ has set the table with more than enough for all. Come!

LAMB OF GOD

- P: Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world.
- C: Have mercy on us, and grant us peace.

- C: We receive your thankfulness, and we offer our forgiveness for any failures. Your influence on us will not leave us, even though you depart from us. We express gratitude for your time among us and ask your forgiveness for our shortcomings and sometimes flagging faith.
- P: I forgive you your failures and accept your gratitude, trusting that our time together and our parting are pleasing to the God we are called to serve.
- CL: As members and friends of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, do you now release Pastor Laurie from her duties as your interim pastor?
- C: We do, with the help of God.
- CL: Do you, Pastor Laurie, release this congregation from turning to you and depending on you?

During our time together, we have experienced laughter and tears, hopes and disappointments. 
