

# **Disaster Preparation Starts at Home**

Did you begin stocking a Disaster Preparedness Kit for yourself in June? If you haven't gotten around to it yet, call the church office at 503-646-0629 or email <a href="mailto:office@standrewlutheran.com">office@standrewlutheran.com</a> to request the "Weekly News" insert from June 2. Together, we're going to take some time each month to better prepare ourselves for everything from power outages to earthquakes.

We're relying on recommendations from the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management for information. If you'd like to get a head-start on your preparations, or are wanting to quickly complete an emergency management kit on your own, visit <a href="https://www.portland.gov/PBEM">https://www.portland.gov/PBEM</a> and explore the many resources they recommend.

Otherwise, you are encouraged to follow along with other St. Andrew folks as we take 12 months to learn how to get ready for unforeseen events. Each month we'll add to our Disaster Preparedness Kit (see column at right), so that by next summer, we'll have **sufficient basic supplies on hand to survive at least two weeks** after an emergency without a lot of help.

Even if you have a well-stocked Emergency Kit, one of your priorities will always be to stay in touch with loved ones not with you. See below to prepare for how you might communicate during a disaster.

#### Make a Communication Plan for Family & Friends

We are a mobile society. People go to work, school, and travel for work or fun, so we need to plan for the possibility of being separated from our loved ones when disaster strikes. In addition to saving phone numbers and email addresses for loved ones on our smart phones, disaster planners recommend that all household members keep an out-of-area contact card in their wallet, purse, or backpack at all times.

#### **Out-of-Area Contacts**

Ask a friend or relative who lives out of your area (at least 100 miles away) to be your contact person. They can send messages to your family in the affected area and then reply back to you. This person is key to an effective communications plan, especially if the internet and cell phone signals are sparse following a major event such as a big earthquake. It's more difficult to think during times of stress. Write down numbers and information ahead of time.

# **Create a Disaster Preparedness Kit Month Two, July 2024**

#### To Do:

- ☐ Date items in your kit and group by expiration date.
- ☐ Install carbon monoxide and smoke alarms.
- ☐ Make a list of bank account numbers, credit card account numbers and companies, and insurance policy numbers, and include in kit.

#### To Collect:

- ☐ First Aid kit
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Battery/hand crank emergency radio
- □ 2 flashlights with batteries
- □ Waterproof matches
- □ Bushcraft knife

Remember that every family is different. If you have someone with special needs to care for or pets to consider, be sure to include them in your Disaster Preparedness Plan.



Principal-Only Payment for Mortgage: \$2,220 was paid this month.




