- Cooking oil



All types of animals are welcome if they are appropriately contained (eg. dogs must be on leash) and do not present a safety concern to others. We would love to see a mix of cats, dogs, turtles, hamsters, and other creatures! If your animal is not able to attend the service, you are invited to bring a photo. You may also bring photos of beloved pets who have passed away, animal species that are endangered, or other animals you would like blessed.

As we did this summer, we will offer a concurrent service in the Sanctuary on <u>October 6</u>. Animals may not attend the indoor service, but you are invited to bring photos of animals to be blessed.

In case of rain: If weather prohibits us from worshiping outdoors, we will send an email cancellation notice, and the inperson Blessing of the Animals will be postponed. Photos of animals will still be blessed at the indoor service.

How to Recycle Shredded Paper

One of the best ways to avoid identity theft is to shred documents with personal information, such as bills and receipts. But don't shred for no reason, because this significantly reduces the paper's recycling market.

It might seem like shredded paper would be as easy to recycle as office paper or newsprint (remember that?), but the reality is much more complicated. Most recycling programs do not accept shredded paper in the recycling bin because staples and other contaminants can be mixed in with shredded paper. Shredding makes the resulting recycled paper less durable and useful since the fibers in shredded paper are typically shorter than other paper or different grades of paper, (some of which has a coating), get mixed in.

As of 2022, Americans consumed about 700 lbs. of paper annually, and we only recover 67.9% of it for recycling. Paper accounts for about 26% of landfill waste and is a prominent source of methane emissions as it breaks down in landfills. Protecting personal information is important in an era when any information can be used to take control of personal or business accounts. There is no law against searching through garbage for personal information.

What can you do? The best option is to reduce the use of paper, which is easier to do in the digital age. If you must use paper and feel it needs to be shredded, recycle it properly. In Metro Oregon (Washington, Clackamas, and Multnomah counties), we are required to put the shredded paper into a paper bag before adding to the recycle bin. Since plastic bags are not to be added to curbside recycling bins, do not put your shredded paper in plastic bags. At my house, we dump our shredded paper into the compost bin. To make compost, you need to add brown and green material. Shredded paper counts as brown material.

Shredded paper recycling process: Shredded paper is classified as mixed paper, so it has to be separated from the cardboard, office paper, and newspaper. That's why it should be bagged in a paper bag. Shredded paper is baled and sent to a mill. At the mill, there are machines called pulpers that introduce water and chemicals to break down the paper into fibers.



Then any ink and adhesive is removed and the paper fibers start bonding together. Finally, the fibers are rolled and dried, then sent off to make new products. Because mixed-paper fibers are smaller than cardboard or office paper, this paper is recycled into lesser-quality paper products such as coffee filters, egg cartons, and paper towels.

Alternatives to shredding paper: In most cases, the information you are trying to delete is only on one or two lines, such as a name, address, or account number. You can use a permanent marker to remove the personal information without shredding the document. This ink is easily removed in the recycling process. And as I said, your compost bin is a perfect place to end the life of your shredded paper. Note that you should not put shredded paper into your yard waste bin.
