Barnes School Christmas Giving Tree



St. Andrew is again providing support for students and families of nearby Barnes Elementary School. Barnes has a diverse student population with 66% of the students being Hispanic and 21% White; those of two or more races and African Americans each make up 4% of the student population.

More than 65% of Barnes students qualify for free or reduced lunch. St. Andrew has supported Barnes school students during Christmas for many years, and we are the only organization that provides this service for these students and families.

Here is how it works:

- 1) Pick a tag (or more than one!) from the tree in the Narthex.
- 2) Write the tag number/s, your name, and your email address on the sign-up sheet under the tree.
- 3) Purchase the item or gift card as listed on the tag (the amount for gift cards is at your discretion).
- 4) With the tag attached, return the item or gift card to the basket by **Sunday**, **December 15**.
- 5) You may include a small age-appropriate toy or book with the gift card.

Cooking for Compost: Low-Waste Thanksgiving Salads

We all know why it's good for us to eat fruits and vegetables. But why is low-waste cooking important? U.S. households toss out about 150 tons of food daily. Food waste has grown by 300% since the 1970's, and the items most likely to be discarded are fruits and veggies, which can easily be composted. Also, integrating fruits into your diet can be a challenge, especially during the fall and winter months when farmers markets are closed. Luckily, there are hearty fall fruits like apples, pears, and grapes. Here are a couple of fall salads to choose from for your Thanksgiving meal.

Of course, the point is to avoid wasting food in the first place, and to send all your trimmings to your compost pile. If you don't have a compost pile, consider freezing the trimmings and giving them to someone who does have one. Find out if you can add food waste to your yard-waste bin. If you don't finish the full recipe at the first meal, be sure to store it in a well-sealed reusable container to keep it fresh to add to different meals for the next couple of days.

Wild Rice Salad with Cranberries

Ingredients

- 1 cup black long-grain or wild rice
- 1/4 cup unsalted sunflower seeds
- 1/3 cup dried cranberries
- 1/4 cup chopped onion or scallion
- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 teaspoons grated orange zest

Instructions: Boil 1 1/3 cups of water. Add wild rice, cover and simmer for 50-60 minutes. Mix together cooked rice and sunflower seeds, toss in cranberries and onion. In a separate bowl, whisk together soy sauce and lemon juice, and slowly whisk in oil until well combined. Pour over rice mixture and toss. Sprinkle orange zest on salad

Chef's tips: Add leafy greens and top with thinly shaved apple slices. Or use this dish as a stuffing recipe.

Autumn Salad

Ingredients

- 2 apples
- 1 pear
- 1/2 cup grapes
- 1/4 cup pecans or walnuts
- 1/4 cup dried cranberries
- 1/2 lemon

Instructions: Cut apples and pear into bite-sized pieces. Squeeze lemon juice over fruit to stop from browning. Slice grapes in half. Simply toss together and voila!

Other considerations: Add it to granola or oatmeal for breakfast. Add a few spoonsful to yogurt for a fruit and protein snack. Add greens to make a classic Waldorf salad. Add to red leaf or butter lettuce and top with gorgonzola cheese. Top with cinnamon and a dash of sugar for a sweet treat.

Roasted Pear and Arugula Salad

Ingredients

- 5 ounces organic baby arugula
- 2 Bartlett or Bosc pears
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup pecans
- 1/2 cup blue cheese
- Raspberry vinaigrette dressing to taste (optional)

Instructions: Slice pears lengthwise into quarters. Slices should be no more than 1" thick. Melt butter over medium heat in a skillet and cook pears for 2-3 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Remove pears and allow to cool. Meanwhile mix arugula, pecans, and dressing.



Add warm pears and top with blue cheese. The sweetness of the pears may be enough, but if a dressing is desired, raspberry vinaigrette pairs nicely with the ingredients.
