Then, on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>December 21</u>, we will resume our normal scheduling of meeting in Fellowship Hall from 9:00 am to 2:30 pm. For either of these Saturdays, you're invited to stop by and help out for however long you're able; bring a lunch if you plan to stay the whole day. All hands are welcomed, needed, and appreciated!

What Goes Into Your Curbside Recycle Bin?

Last week I wrote about James Recycling, a place where you can take hard-to-recycle items that do not go into your curbside bin. This week I want to give you a comprehensive list of things that do go into your curbside recycle bin. While some of you may have blue ones, mine is green with a yellow lid. Different haulers can use different colored bins; some collect recyclables weekly, while others collect every two weeks.

<u>Paper</u> goes in with your comingled/mixed recycling in the green or blue recycling roll cart/bin.

- Newspaper
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Phone books (does anyone get those anymore?)
- Scrap paper
- Junk mail
- Cartons (milk, juice, soup; must be rinsed)
- Shredded paper (must be bagged in paper bag)
- Greeting cards
- Paper towel and toilet paper rolls
- Cardboard boxes. Flatten boxes small enough to fit in the bin. You can also flatten and bundle together large boxes using twine or tape and place them next to the curbside bin. Bundled cardboard must measure 36 inches or less in any direction.

<u>Plastic</u> goes in with your mixed/comingled recycling in the same recycling roll cart/bin. Plastics recycling is based on size and shape, not the little number in the little triangle. Plastics should be rinsed out. Remember, no caps or lids. Caps are too small and lids are too flat, allowing them to get mixed in with flat paper and contaminating the paper.

- Bottles/containers with narrow necks (such as milk cartons or laundry and shampoo containers; 6 oz. or larger)
- Tubs (yogurt, butter, cottage cheese, 6 oz. or larger)
- Plant pots with loose soil removed (4 inches or larger)
- Buckets (5 gallon or smaller, and rinsed/cleaned out)

Remember, plastic drink bottles (water, juice, soda) are redeemable in Oregon. Grab a blue bag from the cart in Fellowship Hall so you can collect bottles to raise money for our youth!


Metal goes in with your comingled/mixed recycling as well.

- Clean aluminum foil (crumple into a ball)
- Clean aluminum pie tin (easily cleaned in dishwasher)
- Empty and <u>dry</u> paint cans
- Empty aerosol cans (such as Pam)
- Aluminum, tin and steel food cans with lids partially attached or crimped inside the can
- Scrap metal (smaller than 30 inches and less than 30 lbs.

You can collect small pieces of metal such as beer bottle caps, glass jar lids, screws, and nails inside steel cans and crimp the can closed. Also, remember that drink cans are redeemable in the state of Oregon, including beer cans, soda cans, and juice cans.

<u>Glass</u> goes in its own bin. Some bins are yellow, mine is red. Glass must be rinsed, also easy to do in the dishwasher. All colors can be mixed together, and labels are OK.

- Salad dressing bottles
- Wine bottles
- Beer bottles
- Sauce bottles



Only add food containers; no broken glass, light bulbs, drinking glasses, dishware, ceramics, flower vases, window glass, or mirrors

<u>Motor Oil</u> goes in a clear plastic bottle with a screw-on lid, such as an empty milk carton or empty soda bottle. Place next to the curbside roll cart or bin. Don't mix with other liquids. No containers larger than 1 gallon.
