### **Christmas Worship Service Schedule**

We will have two opportunities for worship on Christmas Eve Our next New Member Sunday is schedthis year. Our 4:00 pm Service of Lessons, Carols, and Candlelight will be a festive worship experience for people of all ages! The service will include telling the nativity story, singing our favorite carols, Holy Communion, and will end with the traditional candle lighting. Children attending this service will receive a Christmas Bag with activities for them to do during worship. The bags will include an activity booklet that they can color, as well as stickers to place on the pages of the booklet. They will also have jingle bracelets they can "ring" while we sing, a heart to place in the offering plate, and an ornament to put on their Christmas tree at home.



The service at 9:00 pm will be a traditional service with lessons, a Christmas message, beloved carols, Holy Communion, and candlelight. Pre-service music begins at 8:45 pm and will feature organ, piano, flute, marimba, the Sanctuary Choir, and the Bells of Grace handbell choir.

### **Furoshiki Fabric Gift Wrapping**

Ah, Christmas. The most magical time of the year, but also the most wasteful. The food waste, unwanted gifts, and tons of unwanted packaging that barely fit into the recycling bin can be overwhelming with the sheer amount of consumption and waste. On top of this, gift wrapping is also wasteful.

Furoshiki Wrapping is the traditional Japanese art of wrapping packages in fabric. It is super easy and very decorative. All you need is a square piece of fabric; the fabric needs to be about 3-5 times larger than the box. Once gifted, it can be used again and again by either yourself or the recipient of the gift. This is a truly waste-free wrapping method. You can embellish the package with flowers, greenery, cinnamon sticks, or anything you can think of. Visit onelittleproject.com/furoshiki-gift-wrapping, or search online, for videos of Furoshiki fabric gift wrapping ideas. And on top of that, it's fun to do!

#### **Instructions:**

- Cut a square piece of woven (not stretchy) fabric 3-5 times larger than the box you are wrapping.
- Place the square fabric wrong side up with a corner facing you, like a diamond shape.
- Place your gift box in the center with one of the sides of the box facing you; the sides of the box will face the corners of the fabric.
- Fold the bottom corner up and over the top of the box and tuck it under the box on the side opposite you.
- Fold the top corner down toward you and tuck it in under the side of the box closest to you.
- On the sides, fold the fabric in and pinch it together, holding it toward the box.
- Tie the tails together on top of the box, and secure with a double knot.
- You may embellish as you wish. Make a paper gift tag. And voila, you have a beautifully wrapped gift!
