

James Recycling Depot Now Open

You may recall that I have written about James Recycling earlier this year. The following is adapted from <u>jshrecycling.com</u>: "James, age 26, was diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder at age four. James has found his passion in protecting the environment and the welfare of animals. James Recycling helps James understand the powerful impact that recycling can have and gives him the opportunity to provide customers with a meaningful service. James has overcome many challenges and is an amazing young man."

James Recycling recycles difficult-torecycle plastics. James Recycling now has a drop-off depot at 5541 SW Beaverton-Hillsdale Highway that is open on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 11:00 am – 2:00 pm. They will also be open on **December 14** and **January 11** from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm. Other Saturdays will be offered in the new year.



Pop-up events occur monthly at The ARC Portland Metro, 6929 NE Halsey St., Portland, and at Beanstalk Children's Resale Fremont, 3527 NE 15th Ave, Portland. Note that these pop-up events do not take Styrofoam, caps, straws, or utensils. For more details on upcoming events and what will be accepted at them, you can visit jshrecycling.com and click on "Events."

At the drop-off depot, you can recycle:

- * Plastic screw-on and pull-off caps of all sizes
- * Plastic straws and utensils
- * #1 PET plastic, including clamshells and other #1; must <u>not</u> be colored and must have the #1 imprinted
- * #2 HDPE, #4 LDPE, #5 PP, and #6 PS plastic; must have the # imprinted, usually found in a small triangle
- * Empty contact lens blister packs with foil removed
- * Styrofoam (must be clean, dry, and without tape, labels, glue, ink, paint, or food residue; and sorted into categories: For example, packing peanuts, take-out containers, meat trays, egg cartons, and foam blocks must be in separate bags)

Note that the imprinted numbers can be very small and hard to see. You might need a magnifying glass!

Lids, such as ones for yogurt and sour cream, need to be sorted by number. Screw-on caps do not need to be sorted by number. Caps must be taken off of prescription pill bottles.

Fees: James Recycling charges \$3 for each grocery bag of <u>sorted</u> recycling (or similarly sized container) and \$10 per 45-gallon bag of Styrofoam.
