
Later in the month, Tira promises to share tips and tricks on how to convert our favorite recipes to vegan versions.



What's Really Happening at the Border?

Oregon pastors and laypersons who recently witnessed conditions at the Texas/ Mexico border will share their insights during the program "God's Love Knows No Borders: Countering Myths and Uplifting Humane Treatment of Immigrants." This event will be held on <u>Saturday, January 11</u>, from 1:00 pm-3:00 pm at the Lake Oswego United Church of Christ, located at 1111 Country Club Road.



This presentation will also be available via livestream at <u>youtube.com/live/ZAc0caSQnpM</u>. Rev. Adam Hange, pastor of the Hillsboro UCC, and Rev. Keren Rodriguez, a Methodist pastor and community organizer for Portland-based Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice (IMIrJ), will discuss their experiences meeting people affected by border conditions and politics, as well as those providing humanitarian aid. The program will also include a documentary on immigration realities. This event is a fundraiser for the United Church of Christ Rio Grande Valley's crucial work supporting immigrants as they face possible deportation.





New Event: The Last Sunday

The Last Sunday is a brand-new event being hosted at St. Andrew on <u>Sunday, January 26</u>, at 6:00 pm in Fellowship Hall. This will be an opportunity for people in upcoming generations — in the target age-range of 16 to 50 years-old — to come together and find a space of honest community that wants to reclaim the hopeful, restorative, and justice-centered message of Christianity from the corrupt forces that are trying to co-opt it for themselves. The Last Sunday is not owned by any one church — our hope is that this can be a collaborative event with people from a wide variety of faith communities around Portland. We hope that those who attend are refreshed and invigorated by this event so they can bring that energy back to their communities.

This first-ever iteration of this event will center around a meal, a short talk, and group discussion. The nursery will be staffed for children ages five and under to hang out while parents attend the gathering.
