
Bring Your Protest Signs This Sunday!



What Can Go Into Yard Waste Curbside Bins?

Composting is an easy way to reduce the amount of stuff we send to the landfill. The most important things to keep out of the trash, and subsequently the landfill, are food waste, produce trimmings, and any organic material because in the landfill they create methane gas, one of the most potent greenhouse gases.

These are things that can and should go into the curbside yard waste bin:

- Yard debris such as weeds, leaves, vines, grass, and plant clippings
- Small branches (less than 4" thick and 36" long)
- Flowers and house plants
- Pumpkins, windfall fruit, and other vegetables from the garden

Most of us in the Portland Metro area can add food scraps to our yard waste bins. This includes:

- Meat, poultry, fish, shellfish, bones, and shells
- Eggs, eggshells, cheese, and dairy products
- Bread, baked goods, pasta, rice, beans, nuts, and seeds
- Coffee grounds, coffee filters, and tea bags
- Vegetables and fruit, peelings, and pits
- Paper napkins and paper towels
- Greasy pizza delivery boxes (you can tear off the clean box lid and place in your recycle bin)
- Food preparation scraps, plate scrapings, leftovers (although you should eat those), and spoiled food
- Kitchen pail liners: newspaper and paper bags



Keep these items out of your yard bin:

- Large amounts of grease, cooking oil, and liquids
- Ashes
- Dirt, rocks, and sod
- Lumber, treated wood, sawdust, and stumps
- Pet waste
- Large branches (more than 4" thick or 36" long)
- Corks
- Even if a plastic product says compostable, leave it out. Remember these can only be composted at special composting facilities, which are rare and we don't have any in our area.
- Food scraps if your hauler does not accept food waste in their yard waste bins



Lenten Food Train Moving Full Steam Ahead!

The engines are revved up and are hauling triple decker boxcars of food and hygiene products destined for the St. Matthew food bank. To date, we have filled over 16 boxcars with food and 3 with hygiene products. In addition, we've collected over \$2,000. What does that mean? We have the equivalent of 4,000 pounds of food in cash donations and an estimated 800+ pounds in direct food donations. We are nearing an initial goal of 5,000 pounds of food between monetary and physical donations.

Let's see how much farther we can go! Please continue to bring your non-perishable food items (e.g. spaghetti & spaghetti sauce, canned corn, white sugar, rice, and beans) as well as hygiene products (toilet paper, diapers, shampoo, and deodorant) to fill the boxcars. If you would rather donate money instead you can write a check with Lenten Food Drive in the memo line or donate online, selecting Lenten Food Drive as the fund. A new boxcar will be added with every \$250 added to the fund.



As inflation continues to decrease the worth of the dollar, this is a very critical time for those in need in our community. Your donations will make a big difference.



These may be cut flowers from your garden or market (no highly perfumed flowers such as lilies) or potted plants, either blooming or foliage. You may take them home after worship. St. Andrew Foundation Organ Scholarship



The Fund will award one scholarship to a person age 13 – 35. There is a critical shortage of trained organists. We wish to encourage and support the training of talented young pianists to serve as church organists.

To qualify, the student must: Display appropriate motivation for church organ performance; obtain approval from current piano/organ instructor; have played a solo or duet for an audience at a scheduled event within 1.5 years; be age 13 – 35; and reside in Oregon or southwest Washington. Membership at St. Andrew Lutheran Church is not required, but St. Andrew members are encouraged to apply.

The Fund will pay \$500 each semester (summer or fall, and spring) towards organ lessons with a recognized organ teacher. The St. Andrew Lutheran Church organ is available to the award recipient for practice and lessons. A student may re-apply to renew the scholarship after successful completion of one year of lessons.

The scholarship recipient (and parent/guardian if the student is not yet 18) must sign and abide by an agreement to: Practice faithfully and attend lessons regularly; promptly purchase organ playing shoes and music; pay any remaining amount of normal lesson fees; and play an appropriate organ prelude, postlude, offertory, hymns, or liturgy at the usual services of St. Andrew Lutheran Church for one Sunday.

Download an application by visiting the St. Andrew Foundation page of our website. Application is due by **June 1, 2025**. Submit the application to salcf_info@standrewlutheran.com. Qualified applicants will be contacted for an interview with the scholarship committee. Announcement of the scholarship recipient will be made after interviews, and presentation of the award will be during a church service shortly following.

Testing Equipment for the Hearing Impaired

We have a new device on loan that we are testing which may benefit those who struggle to hear spoken word during worship. The device is from a company called Audiofetch, and it broadcasts sound from our soundboard to smartphones. From there you can listen to the service using headphones, earbuds, or even possibly your hearing aid. We are currently only transmitting spoken word, not music.

To use this system you will first need to be connected to the St. Andrew Wi-Fi network on your smartphone. The password for this network is Sanctuary. You will also need to download an app to your phone called Audiofetch. There is a version for both Android and Apple in their respective app stores.



From there you can use your own earphones, headphones, or hearing aids. Please note: If your listening device uses Bluetooth technology there is a delay of about 1 second from when the sound is spoken to when it is heard through your device. That is a limitation of the technology that we cannot fix. This might mean you would experience an annoying echo. If you are using a hearing aid and can easily turn off the hearing aid's microphone this might help the situation.

We have a limited supply of earbuds (along with disposable foam covers), as well as earphone adapters for both iPhones and Android phones without an earphone jack, available to loan.

We also have one smartphone that can be borrowed that is all set with earbuds. As well, we have a device that uses t-coil, so if you have a hearing aid that supports t-coil please let us know as we would very much like to try it out.

I will be available for the 30 minutes prior to worship on Sunday to answer any questions, loan out equipment, or help anyone with set-up. If you try the system, please give us feedback as soon as possible. Thank you!



Job Openings at St. Andrew

St. Andrew is currently hiring two different positions to support our ministries for children and young families.

Nursery Attendant:

The Nursery Attendant will staff the nursery every Sunday morning, with volunteer support. Consistency is so important when building trusting relationships with children and young families. The Nursery Attendant is key in this goal. The Attendant will be paid a \$75 stipend for every Sunday they work—even if no kids are there that week!

Earth Camp 2025 Assistant Director:

The Earth Camp Assistant Director is the #2 person in charge of organizing and leading Earth Camp 2025. They work closely with Camp Director Kyler Vogt to coordinate and train volunteers, design programs, and communicate with the families. This is a vital role for a successful camp, which is why it is paid a \$2500 stipend—funded by Earth Camp Registrations. The work for this role begins when hired, and continues until Earth Camp 2025 is complete.

Palm Sunday Bread For the World Letter Writing Campaign

St. Andrew has been participating in the Bread for the World letter writing campaign for years. This year it is more important than ever to reach out to our representatives and ask them to support legislation that will alleviate hunger in the U.S. and abroad.

Globally, almost 45 million children suffer from severe hunger, and nearly half of all preventable deaths among children under five are attributed to malnutrition. In the U.S., millions of children live in households facing food insecurity.

Child hunger is a local and a global problem, but together we can make a difference.

Join members of the Service Committee during the education hour this **Palm Sunday, April 13** to ask your senators and representatives to protect, restore, and secure robust funding for global nutrition programs, and to fully fund and strengthen the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).

SAMPLE LETTER

Reinstate Foreign Aid and Protect and Strengthen Child Nutrition Programs

I urge you to protect and strengthen nutrition programs that help children reach their full potential.

Specifically, I ask you to:

- Protect, restore, and secure robust funding for global nutrition programs, so that we can reach millions of children with lifesaving assistance.
- Fully fund and strengthen the domestic Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) so that more eligible families in the U.S. are able to enroll and stay enrolled.

For just a small percentage of the federal budget (well under 1 percent), life-saving aid has an outsized global impact. These strategic investments not only save and improve the lives of tens of millions of children every year, they also secure America’s standing as a global leader and trusted partner, open new markets to American goods, and reduce national security threats like terrorism and infectious disease.

In 2023 in the U.S. (the last year for which there is data), the WIC program served nearly 7 million participants per month. Participation in WIC is associated with reduced risk of premature birth, low birthweight, and infant mortality.

Genesis 1:27 reminds us that every person is created in God’s image, and we honor God when we love our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable among us. In the Gospels, Jesus opens his arms and welcomes children, saying “the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.” (Matthew 19:14).

Again, I urge you to protect, restore, and secure robust funding for global child nutrition programs and to fully fund and strengthen WIC in the U.S.

Whether from a fiscal, moral, or faith-based standpoint, the investment in children is more than worth it.
