## Hard but Not Impossible Stuff to Recycle

I love that many of you come to me with your recycling questions! It shows that you care about our environment. This week I want to highlight what to do with many hard-to-recycle things. These are items you have asked me about.

Ridwell is a service that will take many of these items, and several of us in the church have Ridwell. Sadly, it is not available to all addresses. I take much of the stuff that is left on the cart in the back corner of the Fellowship Hall and put it in my Ridwell box. If those of you who have Ridwell would be willing to help me collect hard-to-recycle things, I would appreciate it. Just let me know. Thanks!

James Recycling is a non-profit 501(c)3 organization that collects hard-to-recycle plastics while empowering adults with developmental differences to find independence and purpose through meaningful employment. Their address is 5541 SW Beaverton-Hillsdale Highway, Portland. Go to <u>https://</u> jshrecycling.com for more info and their hours.



Recycle+ is available through your garbage company. They don't advertise it well. You sign up by calling your garbage company, and you will receive a purple bin to place on your curb.

**Prescription pill bottles:** These cannot go into the curbside recycle bin because they are too small. Rid-well, James Recycling, and Walgreens drug stores will take them. Other pharmacies might also take them. Check with your pharmacy. The larger over-the-counter pill bottles such as vitamin bottles hold at least 6 ounces, so they can go into your curbside recycle bin.

**Eyeglasses:** Ridwell takes them occasionally. Optometrists take them and distribute to those in need.

**Fluorescent tubes:** Ridwell and James Recycling take these, but it costs \$4 per tube. You can take fluorescents to Batteries + Bulbs where it costs \$1.25 per tube for recycling or continue to leave tubes on the top of the cart in Fellowship Hall with \$1.25 in an envelope taped to the tube. Ridwell, James Recycling, and Recycle+ all take compact fluorescent bulbs without extra charge.

**Clear plastic clamshells:** Recycle+, Ridwell, and James Recycling take these, or you can deposit them in the collection bins at New Season's stores for free.

**Styrofoam:** James Recycling and Ridwell take this for an extra small fee. No one that I know of takes them for free.

**Textiles, old clothing, old bedding, etc.** Both Recycle+ and Ridwell take these. Ridwell will also take old leather products such as shoes and handbags in their textile category.

**Light bulbs:** Ridwell takes all types of bulbs, whereas Recycle+ only takes compact fluorescent bulbs. You can also bring light bulbs to church and place them in the labeled container on the cart at the back of Fellowship Hall.

**Clear plastic film (produce bags, baggies, plastic bubble Prime envelopes, etc.):** Ridwell, James Recycling, and Recycle+ take these. These are thin stretchy bags. Most grocery stores have a bin for them as well. Note that Ridwell also has another category of plastic bags called multi-layer plastic which is things like potato chip and dog food bags that are crinkly, heavier duty, and not so stretchy.




At left, Maryam poses with her sisters Behtarin and Deianat at St. Andrew's Ministry Fair in 2024.

**Batteries:** No batteries should go into the trash or the recycling bin as they are known to spark fires in the trucks and at waste and recycling facilities. Instead, place any battery that fits into a 1-quart, ziplock plastic bag and place the bag of batteries on top of the glass in your glass recycling bin. This includes rechargeable batteries. You can also bring them to the cart in Fellowship Hall at church. Larger batteries can go to Batteries + Bulbs.
